Subject: Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Dear Valued Customer:

This document contains Data Device Corporation's (DDC) policy regarding the use of Conflict Minerals in its products.

DDC has performed a comprehensive analysis of our product components and the role that suppliers play throughout our manufacturing and product delivery processes. We defined the scope of our 3TG due diligence by identifying and reaching out to our current suppliers that provide components or engage in manufacturing activities that are likely to contain 3TGs (tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold). We utilized the standard tool provided by the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI), including the template developed jointly by EICC-GeSI, known as the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (the "CMRT"). Please be assured that DDC considers this regulatory compliance matter very seriously and is committed to supporting its customers reporting requirements. DDC requires all existing and new suppliers to demonstrate they understand and share this commitment to not procure material from the identified conflict regions and to adopt policies that meet or exceed DDC's expectations. DDC flows down these requirements through its supplier Product Assurance Provisions and through additional policy documents.

Please note that DDC's position in the supply chain for these materials is remote. We do not have a direct relationship with 3TG smelters and refiners, nor do we perform direct audits of these entities that provide our supply chain with the 3TG. We rely upon industry (EICC, Conflict Free Sourcing Initiative, etc.) efforts to influence smelters and refiners to be audited and certified through CFSI's Conflict Free Smelter (CFS) program. DDC has no reason to believe that the minerals utilized in our products may have originated in the covered countries or may not be from scrap or recycled sources.

DDC will provide notice of any new initiatives implemented regarding assessment and mitigation of future risks for sourcing conflict minerals.
